



Grow Guide **All I Want for Christmas Week 3**

1. Read Isaiah 9:6. We've covered two of the names for Jesus in this verse. What's left?
 2. Read Psalm 27:10 and 1 Peter 5:7. Describe what qualities your father (or an important father figure to you) had or has that makes him special.
 3. Read John 10:30 and Matthew 6:25, 33-34. But, isn't God the Father? Why is Jesus called the Father in Isaiah?
 4. Read 1 Peter 2:22 and 1 John 3:5. So, aside from meeting our daily needs, why is Jesus the best Father, a Father we want for Christmas?
- Yes, not only, as Isaiah says, is Jesus eternal (so He will never leave us), but He is sinless, so He will never let us down. He is the Father we NEED for Christmas and the rest of the year.
5. So, we've covered 3 names for Jesus in Isaiah 9. What is the final one?
 6. Read John 14:27, John 16:33 and Philippians 4:7. The peace that is talked about here, is not just absence of conflict. What is it, really?
 7. Read Romans 12:18. To have inner peace, we must, make peace with who, and who else?
 8. Read Ephesians 2:8-9 and Romans 10:9. To have inner peace, we must, first and foremost be at peace with ourselves. As sinners, how can we?

Grace is a wonderful thing, and Jesus provided the sacrifice for it to be an option for us. Truly, He is a Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father and Prince of Peace!
